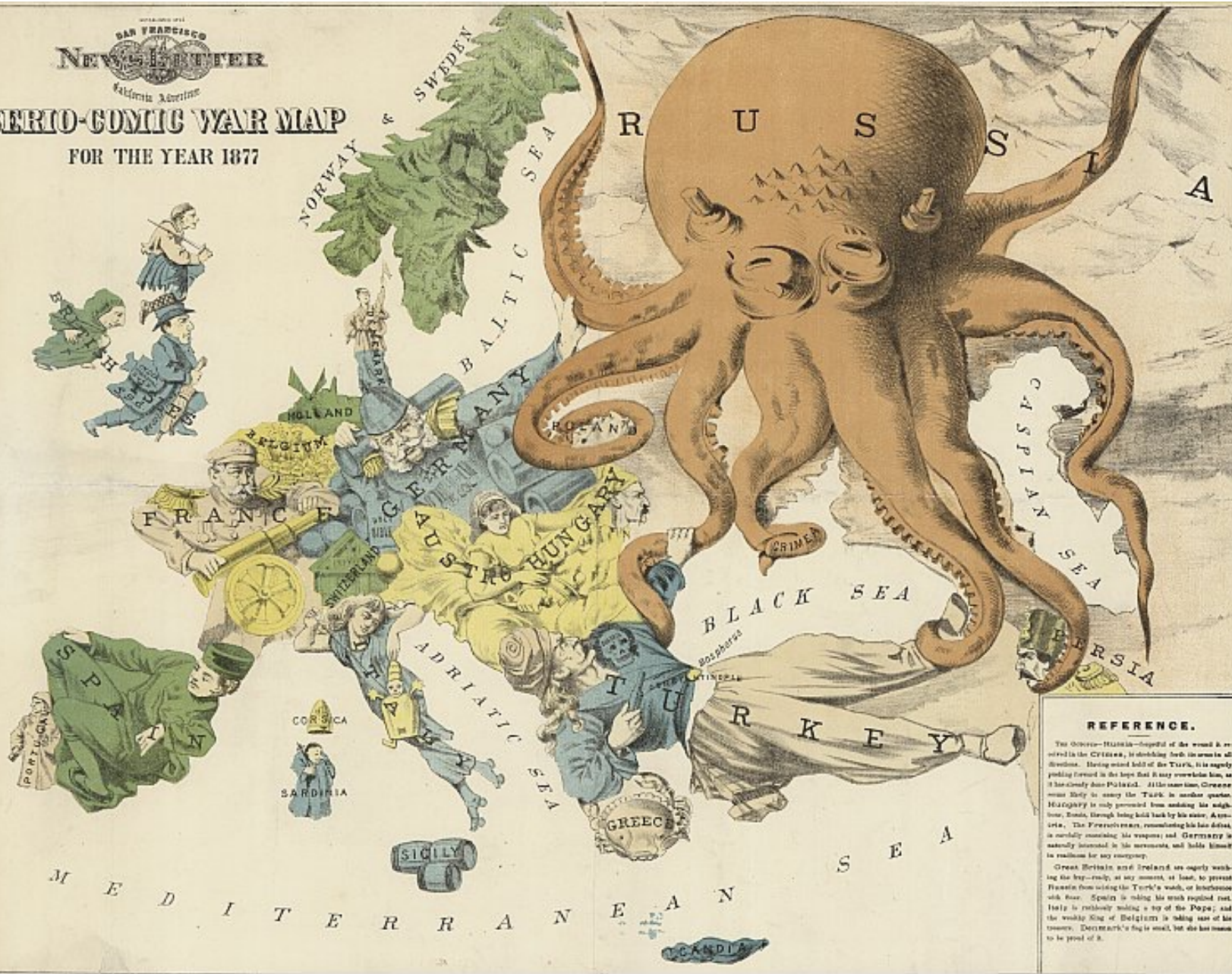

# BRUTAL TENOR OF AUSTRO-HUNGARIAN NOTE TO SERVIA MAKES ITS ACCEPTANCE IMPOSSIBLE

Opinion in European Capitals Is That Ultimatum in Present Form Cannot Be Complied With.

## WAR FEARED INEVITABLE.

Italy Determined to Permit No Increase of Austro-Hungarian Territory—Germany Not Consulted.

Austro-Hungary's Ultimatum to Serbia, the terms of which have now been communicated to the Powers, has fallen like a bombshell upon Europe.

Special dispatches from HERALD correspondents published below indicate that the Ultimatum, in its present perpetually brutal form, cannot possibly be accepted by Serbia.

An official circle in Italy, the opinion is expressed that the terms of the Note tendered on Austro-Serbian war almost inevitable. It is added that Italy will permit no increase of territory by Austria-Hungary as the result of such a war.

The HERALD's Berlin correspondent telegraphs that, although Germany supported her ally diplomatically, she was not consulted concerning the tenor of the Note. As Austria-Hungary acted on her own initiative, the disposition in Germany is to allow her to go ahead alone.

## OFFICIAL ITALY FEARS POSSIBILITY OF WAR.

Situation Being Anxiously Watched in Government Circles.

ROME, Friday.—The tension between Austria-Hungary and Serbia is being watched anxiously by official circles here.

# AMERICAN MARINES ARE AT HAITI'S DOOR

The Frigate, With Force of 800 Men, Reaches Port-au-Prince and Streams for Cap-Haitien.

## WILL INVESTIGATE SITUATION.

If United States Land Troops, Germany May Complicate Matters by Doing Likewise.

(BY COMMERCIAL CABLE TO THE HERALD.)  
New York, Friday.—Mr. A. H. Williams, at Port-au-Prince, cables:—

The Frigate, reported to have 800 marines aboard, arrived this morning and steamed this afternoon for Cap-Haitien, with Mr. Blanchard Farabee, the head of the railway, to investigate the situation.

It is feared, if marines are landed, Germany will land a force after the Americans, complicating the situation.

Haiti will try to obtain another interior loan to meet the interest on the \$500,000 railway debt, due in August.

## REBEL FORCES, BEATEN, ARE RETIRING FROM CAP-HAITIEN.

Intention Is to Make Another Stand at Trou.

New York, Friday.—The HERALD's Cap-Haitien correspondent cables that after two days' fighting the forces of the Government have succeeded in dislodging the rebels from the suburbs of Cap-Haitien.

The total casualties are estimated at 300 men killed and wounded.

The rebels are retiring through the woods toward Trou, where they intend to make another stand.

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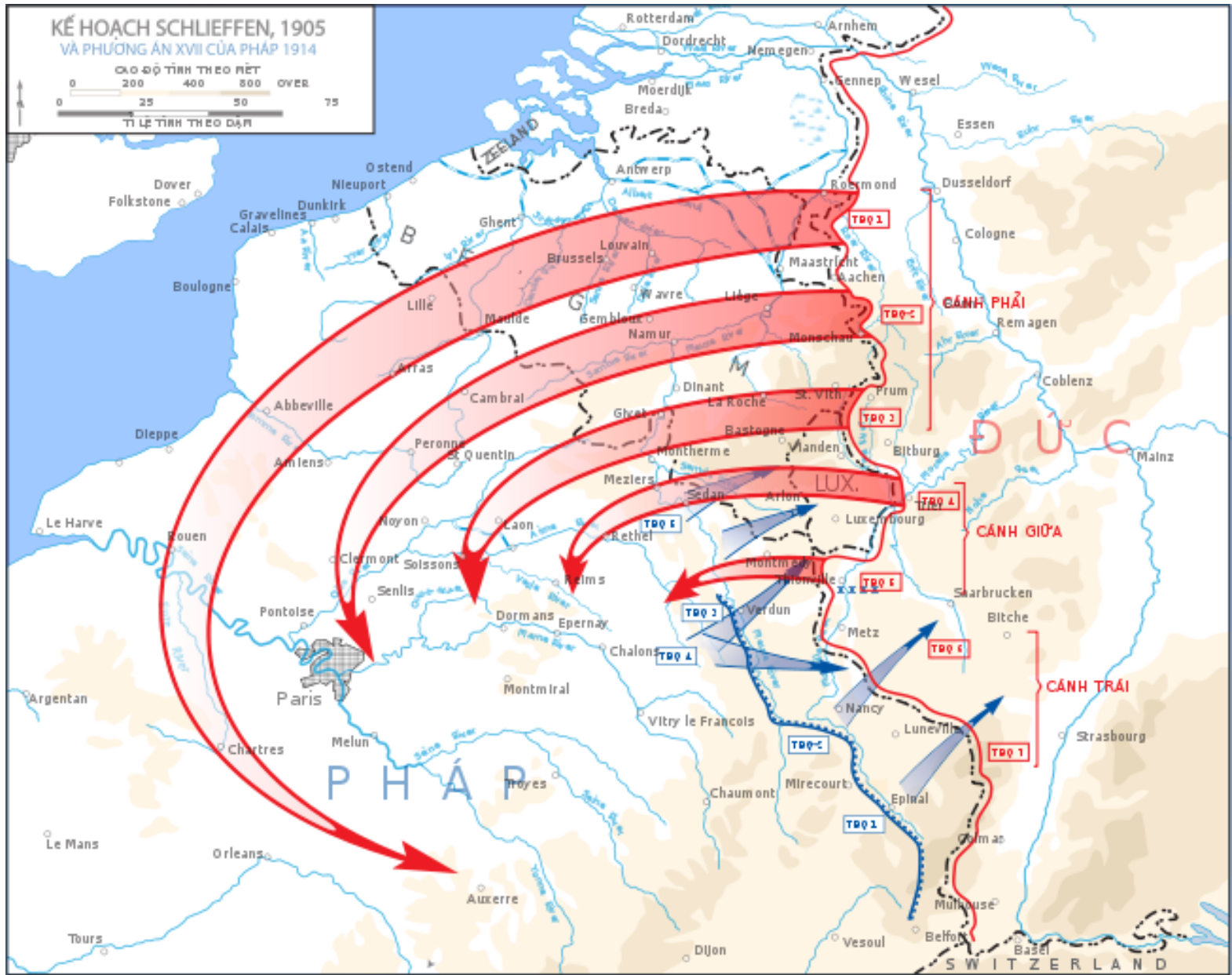

# BRITAIN'S DECLARATION OF WAR

---

London, Wednesday, August 5.—At 7 o'clock last night Great Britain declared war on Germany. There was no formal declaration of war by Germany against Britain.

The announcement of the war declaration was withheld until midnight by order of the King and Privy Council in order to observe the terms of the formal ultimatum.

The official text of the British Government's declaration of war is as follows:

"Owing to the summary rejection by the German Government of the request made by His Britannic Majesty's Government that the neutrality of Belgium should be respected, His Majesty's Ambassador at Berlin has received his passports, and His Majesty's Government has declared to the German Government that a state of war exists between Great Britain and Germany from 11 o'clock p.m., August 4."

The Admiralty immediately after the declarations of war were made flashed this order to the British fleet:

"Great Britain declares war on Germany. Capture or destroy the enemy."

Following this order King George sent this personal message to the fleet:

"I have confidence that the British fleet will revive the old glory of the navy, I am sure that the navy will again shield Britain in hour of trial. It will prove the bulwarks of the Empire."

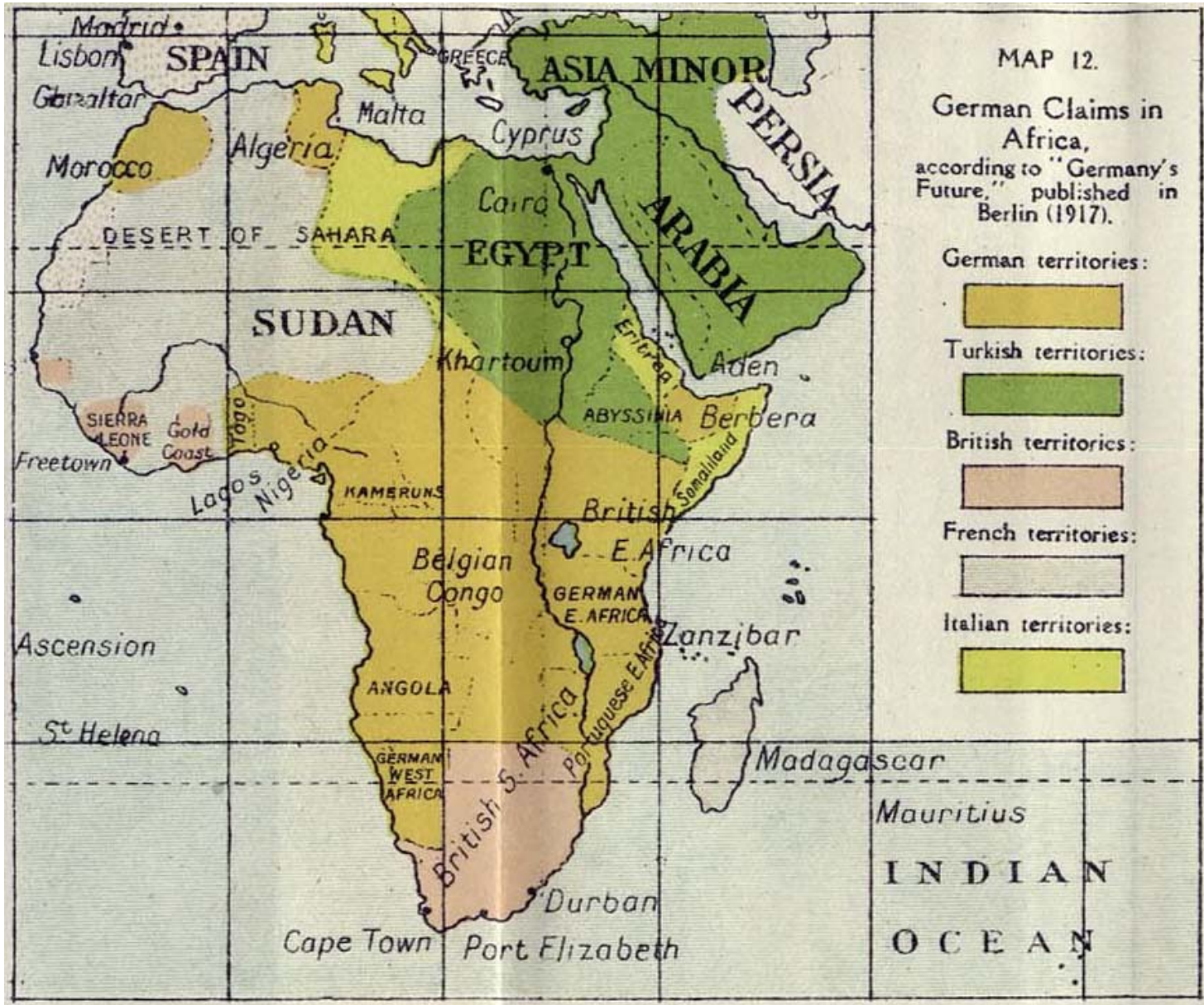

# U.S. OFFICIALLY AT WAR

## WILSON TELLS PLANS FOR RAISING ARMIES

Approves of Conscription of 500,000 Men in Addition to Regulars.

AGE LIMIT IS 19 TO 25

Drafting to Be Practiced in National Guard if Volunteering Fails.

WASHINGTON, April 6.—After proclaiming a state of war the President this afternoon issued the following statement regarding the means to be used in increasing the two million men called for by laws of the war department last night.

"The principle embodied in the plan which the military commission of the house and those here adopted here is approved."

It is proposed to issue the orders for the necessary men by bringing the regular army and national guard up to their full war strength and adding the additional forces by selective conscription. The first increment of 500,000 to make up the so-called additional force will be ordered immediately and other increments called as rapidly as officers can be obtained to train the men in order that all these forces

Inspector of Company F Says Fourth Missouri Infantry Will Be Called.

75 RECRUITS NEEDED

Local Unit Will Probably Take Members From Other Cities.

The mobilization of the Fourth Missouri Infantry of which Company F is a unit, will take place at Nevada about the first of next week. This unit was brought to Columbia by Lieutenant Colonel Burkhardt of the Eleventh Infantry of the U. S. Army who inspected the local company at the armory last night.

Captain Miller said this morning he believed that the inspection was satisfactory to the federal inspector last night, although the company was broken up because many of the members have not returned to Columbia since being mustered out of service on the Mexican border. Those members who were not present for the inspection last night will be inspected at other cities and will be accredited to the Columbia company.

## DRAFTING OF ARMY TO AFFECT STUDENTS

Large Per Cent Come Within Age Limits—Many Have Had Experience.

MUST BE EXAMINED

Recruits Will Be Given Rigid Test and Army Standards Maintained.

"The tentative compulsory military service measure now being considered by Congress will have a wide effect on the students of the university in the University of Columbia," said Captain J. O. King, instructor in military science in the University, this morning.

"Most of the students are within the age limits specified in the bill and many of them have had military experience. There are the men the government will want when nationalized this country."

Captain King said that there is a substantial number of the army men between the ages of 18 and 25 years will be required to enlist. This is not true, according to Captain King, who says that the physical standard of the regular army will be rigidly maintained in the process of selection of recruits. 

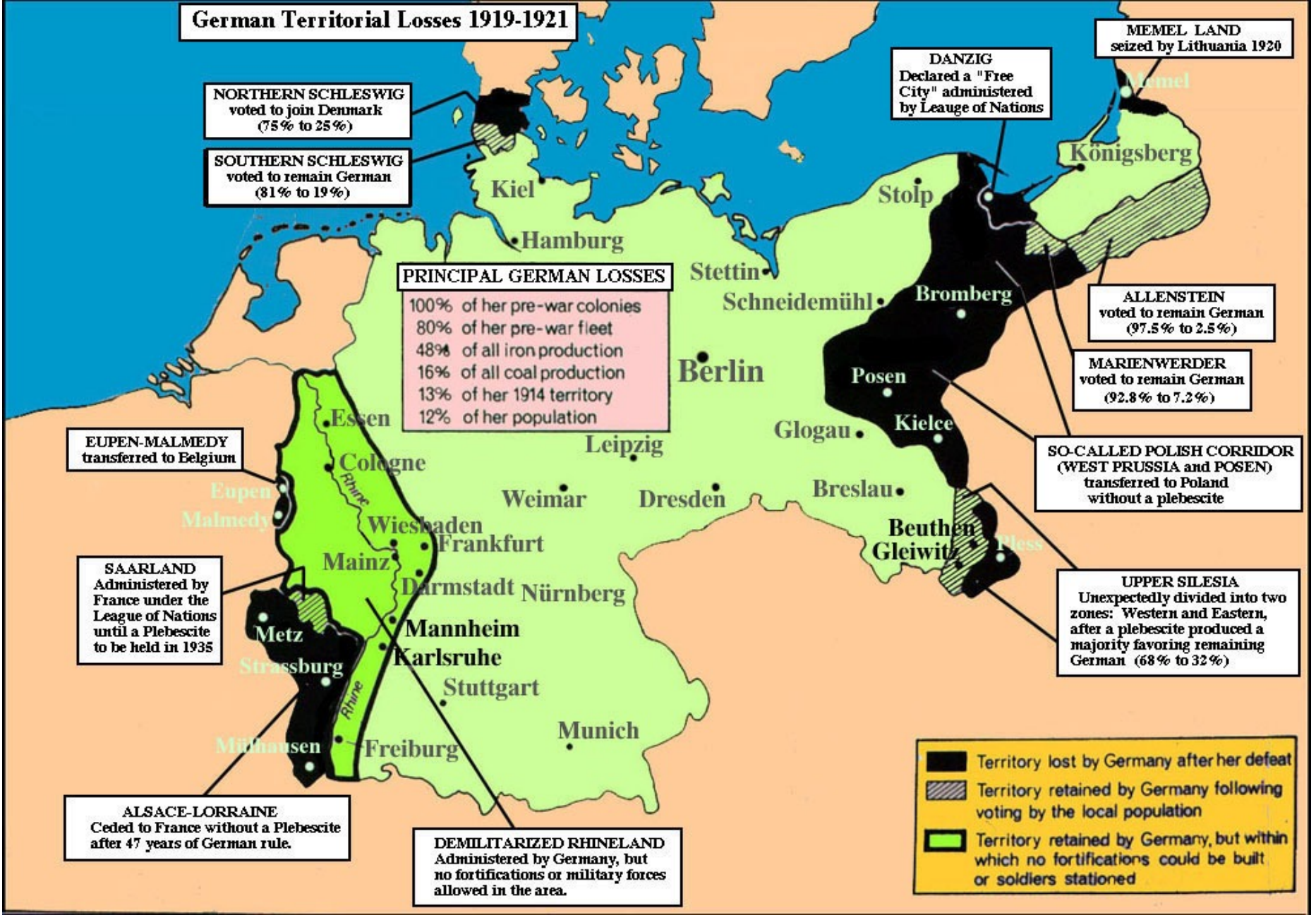

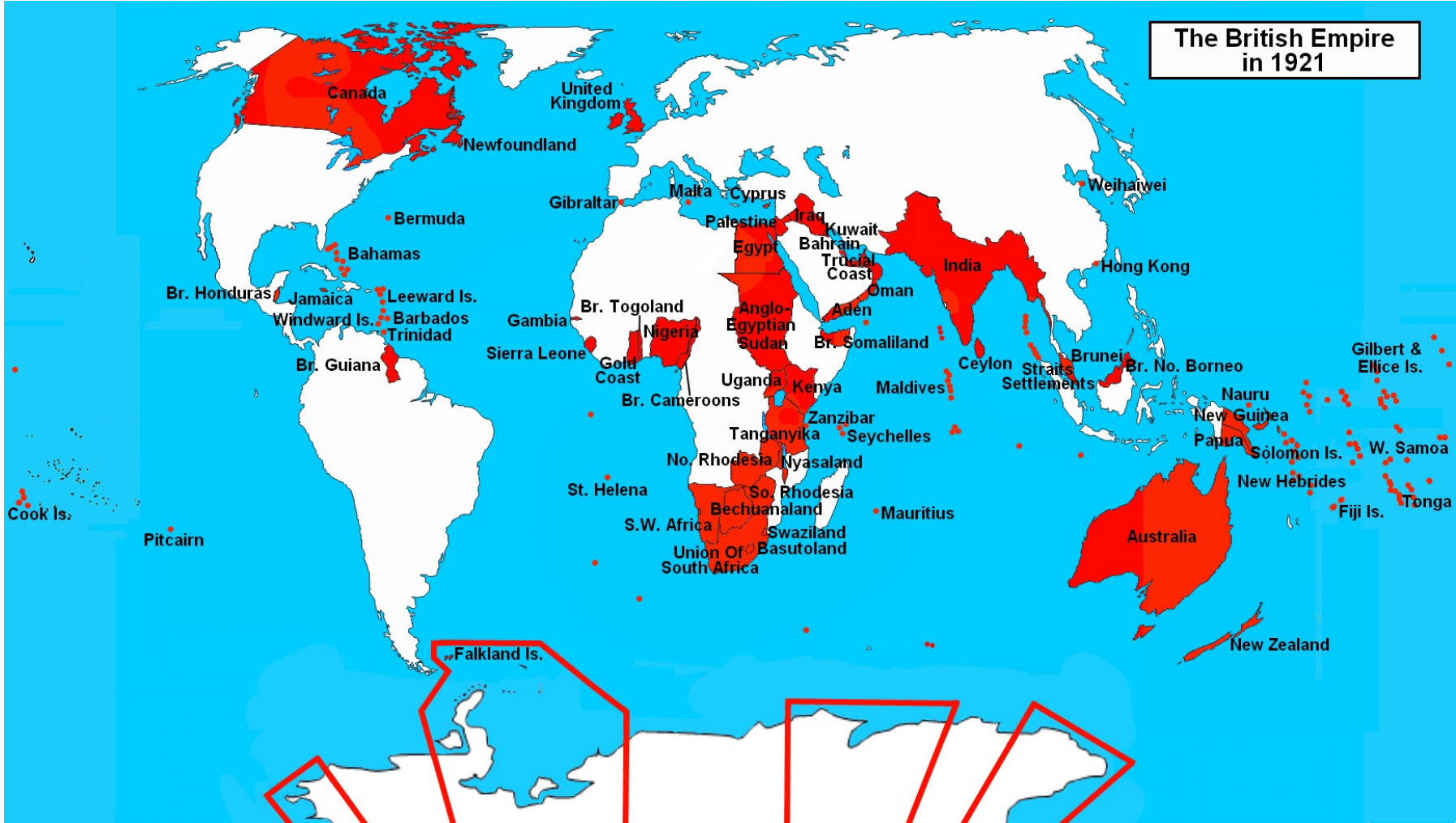
