

# Smile, Is Message of Dr. Carrier to Business Women

"Smile a smile,

All of which means that the above quotation represents the message that Dr. Carrier of the Presbyterian church brought to the members of the Business Woman's club in a happy talk on "Social Democracy" today at their weekly luncheon held at Dickerman's cafe.

"I'm glad you are organizing what we may call a good fellowship club," said Dr. Carrier. "I've often wished I was an angel who could send down all the good things to the poor, but if we will scatter the sunshine of good fellowship to all we come in contact with we'll help in one of the best ways possible. I want to say that during the 18 months that I was privileged to bring good cheer to the soldiers in the war, I want to say that with all I came into contact with I never met the man who couldn't return my smile or salute."

"How we Americans loved each other over seas! That is the spirit we want in our everyday affairs. I remember last summer going to Yosemite valley that everyone we met seemed to be in the happiest vacation mood. The same was true in the black hills of South Dakota. But when we came to dear old dirty, dusty Chicago—I love it—but it was awful. No one knew anyone, and no one cared."

"Go through the day smiling. If you haven't a smile when you get up—put on one! It will make Tucson a better place to live in. Make every stranger who comes to the city feel that it is home. Youth is only a mental condition. You are young as long as you have faith, old when you doubt. We can't all be handsome, but we can all be good looking."

In such phrases as these did Rev. Carrier bring in a forceful manner the value of expressing good fellowship.
