

Guam Report Of Jap Cannibalism

NEW YORK, April 23 (Special).
—Recent reports that the Japanese had resorted to cannibalism in New Guinea are recalled with documented proof that one small isolated group of Japs hiding on Guam indulged in murder and cannibalism.

The Associated Press' Guam correspondent reports that two Jap civilians revealed that a group of Jap soldiers murdered and ate a civilian and a 12-year-old boy when food became scarce.

The story is supported by a Jap sailor, who was with a party which hid in one of the island's many caves. Civilians, it is asserted, unconsciously eat meat which is described to them as "lizards' meat."
