The men knew that he was fleeing from Jehovah - because he had told them so.

When God's child travels the wrong way, or does the wrong thing, or goes into the wrong places, or associates with the wrong people, any word of self - identification may be embarraceing. The godless man had said " If I believed what you say you believe, or professed, what you profess, I would'nt be here, I wouldint do this."

Man can escape from his invironmnet & the people in it, he can avoid facing responsibilities which are unpleasant to him, but he can never escape from himself.

THE CHASTISEMENT OF A PREACHER Jonah 1:4-17

Intro: God does call preachers. As Samuel Shoemaker has said, until something happens to us & in us, it will not happen through us.

Impossible to push & for God to work through you until something has happened inside - a real genuine call.

God's ways with a preacher are often strange - He may call a man from behind the pulpit and place him before an editor's desk, or into some other field of christian service.

You have seen a horse that jumps & dances all over the place whenever he sees his shadow. There are preachers just as "spooky", afraid that they are not equal to their task, or side step their responsibility.

Many great lessons are beought out in the verses We consider

First, God has a definite place & work for every man. Second, Every man can find God's place for him & do the work God would have him do if he will.

Third, if man turns away from God & refuses to do the work God has for him to do, he will have to pay an awful price for his rebellion.

(Laymen)

I. God Stopped Jonah in the midst of his effort to get away

Impressed by the distinct turn of things - strange events-

/ Storm - furious - Jehovah sent - howling madness. This was no ordinary disturbance of wind & waves, it was extraordinary.

The wideness of the greatness of this storm are quite

emphatic:

(1.) God sent - strong word - Jehovah God cast out, or hurled forth the tempest of mighty madness upon the sea. This was no common squall at sea, but a "mighty tempest".

Seen the ocean during storm - hurrican - power to destroy beach - houses - ships etc.

H 2. Ship tossed - point of being destroyed or broken apart.

Mariners - V. 5. Great Fear. These men felt that their ship was about to be broken apart. & that their lives were in danger.

These "old salts", seasoned seamen, veterans of many high winds & rough tides — But this storm made them tremble. (Salt

encrusted clothing from. spray)

They hurled over board the commerical cargo & furnishings & tackle. These men were skilled & had sailed many times upon the sea —

They called upon their gods or duties.

The preacher - strange spectacle - the sleeping run away prophet in the storm distressed ship -

Do not know how much time elasped between the call of Jonah & his boarding the ship - may have fought the call for several weeks or months before attempting to get away from the call.

It is certain that every hour of it was filled with terrific tensions & a real struggle. It was sad rebellion against God. It was inner warefare, a spiritual battle

Jonah had now given way to (physical exhaustion & emotional

prostration. He fell into a deep sleep.

(Sleep) - be in, or fall into, heavy sleep - The idea is discribed as the deep sleep that God caused to fall on the first man when he removed a sidepiece for the making of the woman.

He had gone down into the innermost parts of the ship -probably went beyond the normal arrangements. He was adament
in his purpose, he must have wanted complete seclusion, even
the deep, undisturbed sleep to forget. This would silence
the divine voice, this would give relief! He was aboard ship,
away from land, & on his way from Ninevah, and away from Godts
call. This sleep was not to last long.

II. God disclosed to the world what Jonah had done - 6 - 10

There circumstances led to the exposure of evil
Question - What meanest thou, 0 sleeper? Dread

Jonah faced relities again.

Brought Jonah back to consciousness - The voice of God could not be hushed in the sweet silence of sleep. He must face God again - he must fact the realities:

A pagan skipper, even commanded that Jonah pray for mercy - arise call upon thy God.

There was a period of silence then came these unforgettable and cherished words of counsel: " Son, if God is calling you to preach you had better preach

The Tempestuous storm which swept down upon the ship in WKI which Jonah was felling to tarshish did not come by accident. It was sent for a special purpose
