## JAPANESE STORY OF 1942 RAID

## ATTACK ON SYDNEY

Susuma Ito, proprietor of a little fishing tackle shop at twakuni, Japan, claims that he flew over Sydney Harbour the night before the Japanese midget submarine attack or, May 30, 1942.

Ita then a Japanese naval licutenant, aged 21, told his story in Japan on Monday.

This is want he said;

"I was a pilot of a Zero float-plane, carried by a Japanese ocean-going submarine of 3,302 tons.

"We arrived on Mayor Island, Bay of Plenty (New Zealand), in paten dark one morning late in May, 1942. Gur submaring carried midget submarines which were designed to be used to atack naval ships at Auckland and Sydney.

## AUCKLAND SLEPT

"Our warplane was founched from the submarine and 1 prickly reached Anckland, Winh the city slept 1 cruised overhead unmolested and never climbing above 1000 feet, I was pever challenged or discurbed by intercepting fighters.

"I had large scale maps of Auckland and Sydney

"I soon located Devonport Navai Base and gave it special attention For the better part of an hour I looked for warships but found nothing that would warrant attack by one of our midget submarines."

"I flew back to the mothe, submatine and reported that there were no warships at Auckland.

The submarine commander then decided to proceed to Sydney. We crossed the Tasman and surfaced off Sydney Heads on May 25. Once again 1 took off in darkness.

## FLIGHT OVER SYDNEY

"Unlike Auckland, I found the Sydney air rather crowded. There were Australian planes doing night-flyin; exercises, but I was not molested.

"The Australian pilots did not aplear to notice me, although the ions, streamlined single float of my Zeio should have, been conspicuous. should have, been conspicuous.

"I sighted what I considered to be suitable targets in Sydney Harbour and lost no time returning to the submarine and making my report.

"Midget submarines were released. Later 1 left in the mother submaring for Rabaul."

Ito said he spent about an hour over Auckland. His flight over Sydney was every much briefer."
